The goals of the Research Grant Program include:

- Exploring psychodynamic and psychoanalytic perspectives via research

CAPA's Research Grant Program currently is seeking applications for projects within, but not limited to, the scopes listed here:

Progress reports and a manuscript submitted for publication are expected.

Member Interview

Lynn Somerstein, PhD

Lynn Somerstein, PhD has been a CAPA member since 2011. She has been a teacher and supervisor over the years. Her support of CAPA also includes interviewing Basic Training applicants as part of the admissions process. Lynn traveled to China with CAPA's tour in 2011.

Describe your current work and/or type of practice, or if retired, describe the work you used to do.

I'm a psychoanalytic psychotherapist. I mostly work via Zoom, but I see people in person too. Zoom lets me work with people wherever I am and wherever they are. I love it!

Please describe your career path, including your educational development such as additional degrees or institutes you attended as you built your career.

I was always inclined to help people. I worked as a youth counselor in Israel in 1967 and 1968, and briefly worked in civil defense. I returned to New York and began working with youth here too, both for HARYOU Act and for NYC services, where I counselled children in foster care and their families.

I realized that I needed help myself, and I started psychoanalysis. Soon I began studying at NPAP and used the concepts I was learning in my work with my own clients. I was impressed by the power of psychoanalysis. During this time, I also got a master's degree in psychology at the New School for Social Research, and eventually a PhD at Union Institute and University. This was all a long process, during which I became a certified yoga teacher and a certified yoga therapist.

Who would you say is the person that influenced your career the most, and how so?

Leila Lerner, who was my psychoanalyst, and Art Robbins, who was my psychoanalytic supervisor for decades, were both strong influences. They listened with sympathetic understanding as I explored my difficult childhood. They were realistic and accepting of me, and I felt that they cared for me and understood me. Together they saved my life.

How did you first hear of CAPA, and please describe why you feel a connection to CAPA's mission?

A colleague, I don't remember who, mentioned CAPA, and I investigated. The idea of working with people in China, visiting China, learning about China, was deeply appealing. I have always been curious about the many ways that people live. CAPA's mission to share the benefits of psychoanalysis, help people, and teach people is close to my heart. After all, psychoanalysis saved my life. I want that for others too.

Student Interview

LIANG Jing (Stacy) 梁静

LIANG Jing (Stacy) 梁静 is a member of Class N and currently enrolled in her final year of the Advanced Training Program.

Where do you live and practice? Chongging.

Describe your current work and/or type of practice.

I currently work at a university mental health center and also see some patients privately.



In three words (ways), can you describe your experience at CAPA so far?

The **systematic** way of learning. This four-year journey to complete both basic and advanced training includes reading classic materials and meeting with instructors and peers at fixed times each week. This process resembles long-term therapy, where one experiences companionship and growth in an open, safe, and stable environment.

Diverse. Here, we will encounter peers and instructors from various backgrounds and cultures, each offering unique perspectives on psychoanalysis. This interaction enriches my understanding of psychoanalysis and fosters greater openness toward myself, the therapeutic process, and my patients.

CAPA **community**. As a therapist, occasional loneliness is inevitable. We need support, mutual understanding, and shared experiences from colleagues. The CAPA community provides this platform, offering valuable resonance and support from diverse teachers and peers along the way.

What has helped your practice the most since you began training at CAPA?

Learning from various instructors, peers, and materials, I gradually apply these insights in my practice. Although I still occasionally feel frustrated in my career, my growing self-trust, combined with self-awareness, helps me maintain greater openness and stability in my work.

Do you envision yourself staying involved with CAPA after you graduate, and if so, how?

Sure, I plan to apply for the infant observation and supervision program in the future when I am prepared.

In what ways has CAPA surprised you?

Seeing experienced, elderly instructors who remain full of enthusiasm and passion for sharing their wisdom through teaching or supervision inspires me. Working with people is always full of unknowns, and I can imagine having a similarly long and continually learning career myself.

Graduate Interview

YU GuoYu (Jade) 虞国钰

YU GuoYu (Jade) 虞国钰 began CAPA in 2015 (Class H) and graduated from the Advanced Program in 2019 and the Supervision Training Program in 2020. YU GuoYu (Jade) 虞国钰 is also an analytic candidate at the New Center for Psychoanalysis.

Where do you live and practice?

Shenzhen, GuangDong Province, China.

Describe your current work and/or type of practice. Private practice for adults and adolescents in Shenzhen City.



Reflecting back, what was your first thought when you heard of CAPA?

Before my initial encounter with the CAPA program, it was shrouded in an aura of prestige, with hushed accolades circulating in the professional community. My direct engagement with CAPA commenced during a recruitment seminar conducted by Elise in my city in 2014. During this event, I posed a potentially sensitive inquiry to Elise, encompassing topics of taxation and ethics.

The seminar and subsequent discussions revealed that CAPA offers an exceptionally sophisticated and meticulously crafted curriculum, staffed by a cadre of seasoned educators, supervisors, and analysts dedicated to the academic and professional development of its students. The program's continuous immersive teaching approach is a testament to its innovative and distinctive methodology, setting it apart from other psychoanalytic psychodynamic training programs available in China back then. Recognizing CAPA's unparalleled value and unique position within the field, I enrolled without reservation the following year. Despite the initial challenge of locating CAPA's website and application channels, my participation in the program marked the beginning of an enlightening and transformative educational journey.

During your time as a student, describe the most useful thing that CAPA helped you with (career-wise or personally).

Embarking on the journey of CAPA entails a rigorous commitment, notably the requirement to present patients in the CC class. Initially, this posed a challenge for me, as I was then practicing as a part-time therapist. To meet the ongoing requirement, I had to swiftly expand my client base, which facilitated my transition to a full-time therapeutic practice within a relatively brief time frame. This professional metamorphosis was a pivotal moment in my career trajectory. I made the strategic decision to relinquish my 15-year career as a lawyer to pursue a vocation in psychotherapy and am now in the process of furthering my expertise by training to become an analyst. Besides that, I was navigating the complexities of a personal divorce. The mandatory personal analysis component of the CAPA program provided invaluable support and insight during this period, aiding in my personal and professional growth.

As a member of one of an earlier CAPA class, please describe why and how you have stayed connected with CAPA, even after graduating.

During my tenure at CAPA, my aspiration to make a more significant contribution to the CAPA community and the broader Chinese psychological community burgeoned. This desire prompted me to become actively involved with the CSO (CAPA Alumni in Shenzhen), initially serving in the role of treasurer and subsequently being elected as its president. Three years ago, I was honored to be appointed as the president of CIC (CAPA in China). Under my leadership, I facilitated the establishment of the legal department, an ethical study group, and subsequently, an Ethics Committee. Additionally, I played a pivotal role in organizing the First Annual National Conference of CIC that was held in December 2023. These initiatives have allowed me to maintain a robust and enduring relationship with CAPA, demonstrating my commitment to the advancement of psychology in China.

Is there a CAPA member, perhaps a teacher or supervisor, that to this day stands out in your mind to have influenced you, encouraged you or supported you in an unexpected way?

The collective growth of Chinese students and the advancement of CAPA owe a significant debt to the enduring contributions of Dr. Elise Snyder. Her influence has been pivotal, akin to a beacon and a grandma for the CAPA community. Dr. Snyder's foundational work in establishing CAPA has realized the vision imparted by Sigmund Freud to the former Minister of Education of China, Zhang Shizhao, in 1929: "introduce psychoanalysis to your native country, China." Her pioneering spirit continues to be a guiding force for my professional journey and that of numerous Chinese therapists. In addition to Dr. Snyder's profound influence, I have been profoundly affected by my supervisor, Thiago Sarkis. My collaboration with him commenced during my fifth year of CAPA. As an unorthodox Lacanian, he illuminated for me the profound and captivating dimensions of Lacanian thoughts. Our collaborative exploration spanned two years, but was tragically cut short by his untimely passing, which left an indelible void. In the year preceding his passing, I was confronted with the profound loss of a cherished friend to leukemia. Thiago's support was invaluable in navigating the complexities of grief. While the full implications of these intertwined experiences are still a subject of contemplation, I remain dedicated to the exploration of death, religions, and psychoanalysis. With an evolving perspective, I am increasingly convinced that psychoanalysis provides the most authentic approach to confronting the indelible realities of human existence. It is this truth that is the ultimate source of health and strength.
